Beinecke Scholarships

Substantial award (\$32,000) for students of exceptional promise to attend grad school in the Arts, Humanities, Soc Sciences.

Eligibility: Must be juniors, have a 3.7 GPA and have a documented history of receiving need-based financial aid as an undergraduate.

Provides a substantive work experience for students with serious career interest and background in international affairs. A very strong overall academic record is required. Students graduating in 2008, 2009, 2010 are eligible to apply. International students eligible to work for a year after graduation may apply. Ten students will be hired to work at the Endowment on a full time basis for one year.

Eligibility: BA, preferred majors IR, Government, Economics, History, Russian Studies.

Funds year of study, self-designed research, or English teaching abroad. Provides transportation, tuition and stipend for one year. Choose from 140 different countries.

Eligibility: US citizen, post BA, any major. Language proficiency for host country required for all research grants. Language requirement varies for teaching program—see website country listing. Online application required.

Goldwater: The Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship

Intended to alleviate the shortage of scientists, mathematicians, and engineers. Awarded to students who will be college juniors and to those who will be seniors who have outstanding potential and intend to pursue careers in the above-stated disciplines. Award covers tuition, fees, books, and room and board, up to a maximum of \$7,500 annually. Junior-level scholarship recipients are eligible for a maximum of two years of support, senior-level recipients are eligible for a maximum of one year.

Eligibility: sophomores, juniors, US citizen, high GPA, demonstrated potential for career in Math, Natural Sciences, and Medical Research.

Provides an experience in Asia to broaden professional perspectives and perceptions of Asia. The program is experiential rather than academic in nature, placing its Scholars in internships where they can make a professional contribution to their host organization while learning some of the

many things that Asia has to teach. Program is intended for young leaders who have had no prior experience of Asia and might not otherwise have such an opportunity. Scholars receive a monthly stipend, air transportation, medical insurance.

Eligibility US Citizens, BA, clearly defined career interest in a specific field, potential for accomplishment, strong motivation for chosen field, evidence of leadership, more than usual openness to new ideas and a sensitivity to fellow human beings, flexibility, adaptability and sensitivity in an Asian setting

NSF: National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship

Provides stipend and cost-of-education allowance for three years of graduate study in U.S. or abroad, leading to a research-based MS or PhD in: math; physical, biological, behavioral or social sciences, includes history of science, philosophy of science; computer science, engineering. **Eligibility:** U. S. Citizen, GRE (general and subject tests), may not have completed more than 20 semesters hours graduate work, potential to contribute significantly to research, teaching, industrial applications in Science, Math or Engineering, high academic achievement, relevant undergraduate research, career plan that shows motivation, initiative, creativity, commitment.

Bring 32 Americans every year to pursue two years of study at the University of Oxford. Requires intellectual distinction, integrity, respect for their fellow beings, leadership ability. Scholars are expected to play an influential part in the betterment of society, wherever their careers may take them. **Eligibility:** US citizen, BA, any major, GPA 3.7+.

Rotary International Ambassadorial Scholarships

Soros: Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans

Provides opportunities for New Americans. Provides grants for up to two years of graduate study in the US. Fellows receive annual grant of \$20,000 and tuition grant of half the tuition cost of the US graduate program.

Eligibility: New Americans –resident aliens, naturalized U.S. Citizens, or child of two parents who are both naturalized citizens. A Green Card holder must have had more than one year of IRS filings and regard the U.S. as their principal residence and focus of national identity. BA, GRE taken by October. Initiative demonstrated in any area of life. Capacity for accomplishment, demonstrated through activity that has required

drive and sustained effort, commitment to the values of U.S. Constitution and The Bill of Rights

Truman: Harry S. Truman Scholarship

Awards scholarships to college students who wish to attend graduate school in preparation for careers in government, the non-profit sector or public service. \$27,000 for two or three years of graduate study, priority admission, leadership training and internship opportunities in the federal government. Scholars may attend schools in the US or abroad.

Eligibility: Juniors, US Citizens (or US National from Pacific Island), GPA 3.7+, extensive record leadership, service, commitment to public service career.

Udall: The Morris K. Udall Scholarships

Awarded to undergraduate students who intend to pursue careers related to the environment or to Native American and Alaska Native undergraduate students who intend to pursue careers in health care and tribal public policy. Covers expenses for tuition, fees, books, and room and board, up to a maximum of \$5,000. Scholarship recipients are eligible for one year of scholarship support.

Eligibility: Sophomores & Juniors, majors in Environmental Science, Natural Sciences, and the Social Sciences, GPA 3.0+, U.S. Citizenship, U.S. Nationals, or resident aliens. Career objectives related to the environment, potential to make a significant contribution in chosen field.
