The general registration fee is \$100. The registration fee for residents of the greater New London area is \$40. The fee includes receptions, refreshments, admission to all sessions, and limited shuttle service between campus and the conference hotel.

Conference registration is offered on a first-come, first-served basis until the limited seating capacity is filled. Information on discounted lodging, free parking on campus, and other pertinent matters will be sent with your confirmation and in subsequent mailings. Registrations will be confirmed by email upon receipt.

LOCATION

The conference will take place on October 16-18, 2009 on the Connecticut College campus in New London, Connecticut. New London is located on Interstate 95, approximately midway between New York City and Boston (two hours to either by car). At a one-hour distance to the north and south, respectively, are Providence and New Haven. There are Amtrak, bus, and ferry (from Long Island) stations in New London, and the closest airports are Providence (the most convenient airport) and Hartford, both about one hour from campus.

Connecticut College is within thirty minutes of the scenic oceanfront villages of Noank, Mystic, and Stonington, as well as the Foxwoods and

Mohegan Sun casinos. Autumn foliage is usually spectacular around the time of the conference.
