



# Sponsored Activities

#### Lectures

The Friends of the Library sponsors several lectures throughout the year, including the Faculty Book Talks, in which College faculty present their recent research to a general audience. Book talks are generally held once per semester in the Charles Chu Asian Art Reading Room. The Friends are also an important contributor to the Sound Lab Foundation lecture, which seeks to bring national figures to campus in late September or early October to speak on social, cultural, or scientific topics.

#### **EXHIBITIONS**

The Friends of the Library helps to support exhibitions in the Charles E. Shain Library exhibition area and in the Charles Chu Asian Art Reading Room by funding and publicizing openings and receptions and through the occasional publication of exhibition catalogs.

#### Collections

Funds from the Friends of the Library aid in the purchase and preservation of rare materials for the Linda Lear Center for Special Collections & Archives. These funds have been used to build a substantial collection of artists' books and enhance the Gildersleeve Collection of Children's Literature and manuscript collections.

#### SCHOLARSHIP

The Library Scholarship is presented annually to a Connecticut College senior or graduate who is enrolled in an advanced degree program in library science, archival studies, or book preservation. Students are asked to submit a personal statement in early March for review by a select committee. The winner of the award is announced in mid-April. In 2015 Karla Umland ('93) was awarded the Library Scholarship.
