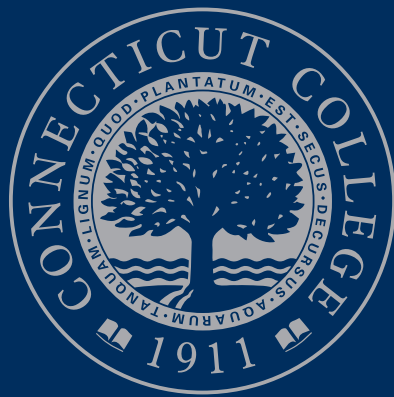

CONNECTICUT COLLEGE'S ELEVENTH PRESIDENT

KATHERINE BERGERON

Katherine Bergeron became the 11th president of Connecticut College in January 2014. Over the past eight years, her work has focused on building the College's academic, residential, community, and financial strength. Bergeron was an early champion of the faculty's development of Connections, a bold new venture in integrative education that prepares students for leadership in an interconnected world. Under her leadership, the College received several of the largest single gifts in its history in support of financial aid, career education, student success, athletics, and the arts. In Fall 2021, the College publicly launched the \$300 million "Defy Boundaries" campaign, which aims to invest in facilities, programs, and endowment to promote the excellence of faculty and staff and elevate the student experience.

Capital projects completed during her tenure include the renovation of the Charles E. Shain Library; the creation of both the Walter Commons for Global Study and Engagement and the Hale Center for Career Development; and the transformation of the College's historic art deco theater, Palmer Auditorium, into the Nancy Athey '72 and Preston Athey Center for Performance

and Research. The formal rededication of the Athey Center took place in April 2022. Projects now underway include the revitalization of the College's waterfront on the Thames River and the renovation of Hillyer Hall into the new Stark Center for the Moving Image, slated to open in Fall 2022.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Wesleyan University, Bergeron earned master's and doctoral degrees in music history from Cornell University, and wrote two prize-winning books on French music and culture. Before coming to Connecticut College, she was dean of the college and professor of music at Brown University. She currently serves on the Board of the American Academic Leadership Institute and on the Board of Directors of the Eastern Connecticut Symphony Orchestra. She has served as a member of the Board of the Association of American Colleges and Universities and is the past chair of the Board of Directors of the Council of Independent Colleges. She has hosted a podcast, *Think.Do.Lead.*, about creativity and innovation, and has co-taught, with her husband, media artist Butch Rovin, a course on songwriting that has yielded three albums of original songs by Connecticut College students.

HONORARY DEGREES

PATRICK AWUAH

An entrepreneur and educator, Patrick Awuah is a visionary leader who created Ashesi University College in 2002 with the mission of educating a new generation of ethical and entrepreneurial leaders in Africa. A graduate of Swarthmore College with bachelor's degrees in engineering and economics, he worked for a decade as an engineer at Microsoft before returning to school for an M.B.A and eventually to his native Ghana to launch his enterprise in higher education.

Awuah has been recognized around the world for his educational innovation and inspiration. Ashesi, which means "beginning" in the Akan language, is the only college of its kind in Africa, advancing science and engineering in the liberal arts tradition and instilling integrity through its student-run honor code. What started in 2002 with 30 students in rented facilities is today recognized as one of the top African universities, with more than 1,000 international students from nearly every African nation and more than 1,800 alumni, many of whom continue to live and work in Ghana.

Connecticut College's relationship with Ashesi began in 2014 when a small group of faculty, supported by The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, visited the university to

explore potential global partnerships. The connection was formalized in 2016 and since that time, faculty, staff and students from both institutions have participated in a variety of courses, trips and other activities. In 2018, an official semester-long exchange program was launched, with both institutions agreeing to welcome visiting students.

In 2007, Awuah received Ghana's highest service award, the Membership of the Order of the Volta, by His Excellency President J.A. Kufuor. In 2015, Awuah won a MacArthur "genius grant" and Fortune magazine named him one of the 50 greatest world leaders. And in 2017, the World Innovation Summit awarded him its prestigious education prize for his transformative work in African higher education. He is a fellow of the Africa Leadership Initiative; a member of the U.S. Council on Foreign Relations; a member of Pacific Council on International Policy; and an appointee to the UNESCO Futures of Education Initiative.

For his revolutionary achievements in higher education in Ghana, the College is proud to confer upon Patrick Awuah the Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*, an award that reflects his shared commitment to our own mission of the liberal arts in action.

HONORARY DEGREES (Contd.)

LINDA J. LEAR '62

Acclaimed historian, environmentalist, and author Linda Lear '62 is known for her definitive biography, *Rachel Carson: Witness for Nature*, (1997; 2009), and, most recently, for *Beatrix Potter: A Life in Nature*, (2007), published in the U.K. and the United States. The latter was awarded the Lakeland Book of the Year in the U.K., the first time the prize was given to an American author. Lear was also the editor of *Lost Woods: The Discovered Writing of Rachel Carson* (Beacon Press, 1998), a collection of Carson's writings over her career. She has published many scholarly and popular essays on Carson, including new introductions to the 40th and 50th anniversary editions of *Silent Spring* (2002, 2012).

Lear earned a B.A. in history from Connecticut College in 1962 and a master's in history from Columbia University in 1965, where she graduated with honors. She received a Ph.D. in history from George Washington University in 1975 and was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Chatham College in 2007. As a full-time writer and lecturer, Lear enjoyed a long and distinguished career as a professor of environmental history at George Washington University and the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, as well as other colleges and universities where she held administrative and research positions, including visiting professor of American literature in 2002 at Connecticut College and as a member of the Summer Alumni College faculty.

As a member of the Connecticut College Board of Trustees from 2004-12, she served as chair of the Committee on Academics and as a member of the Executive Committee and the Facilities & Infrastructure Committee. She established the Lear/Carson Collection in Special

Collections in 2002 to promote undergraduate and scholarly research on Rachel Carson's life and work. That same year, Lear served on the Advisory Board of the Goodwin-Niering Center for the Environment and established a fund to honor the late Elizabeth Babbott Conant '51 (former professor of zoology, dean, and trustee of Connecticut College), a fund that supports a bi-annual environmental conference held at the Center.

A generous gift from Lear allowed the College to open the Linda Lear Center for Special Collections and Archives in October of 2008. The new reading room and archival facilities promote research and scholarship using the Special Collections held by the College, and provide for the display of key holdings. In 2016, a new position, the Linda Lear Special Collections Librarian, was created with her support and in 2019, she established an endowed student research and travel fellowship in honor of the late Connecticut College professor of history Richard Lowitt. The Richard Lowitt-Linda Lear Fellowship for Primary Research in History supports research collaboration each summer for two faculty members in the history department and two students pursuing honors or independent studies.

Lear's many accolades include the Goodwin-Niering Alumni Achievement Award in 1998. She received the College Medal in 2013, the highest honor bestowed by the College.

In recognition of her seminal work as an environmentalist and historian, the College is proud to confer upon Linda Lear the Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*, with gratitude and admiration for her scholarship and environmental advocacy.

THE OAKES AND LOUISE AMES PRIZE

The Oakes and Louise Ames Prize, named for a president emeritus of the College and his wife, is given to a graduating senior who has completed the year's most outstanding honors study. The prize is offered by the trustees in recognition of the quality of academic achievement that Oakes and Louise Ames fostered during their 14 years of service to Connecticut College.

MADLINE WASHBURN BANK '20

Madeline Washburn Bank, a dance and art history major and scholar in the Museum Studies Certificate program, was awarded the 2020 Oakes and Louise Ames Prize for her honors thesis in the Department of Art History, "The Female Body, Myth, and Sexual Power: Women in Italian Renaissance Art."

Bank's trans-historical, genre-defying thesis reconsidered 15th- and 16th-century Renaissance artworks in the context of Renaissance women's histories and critiqued the ways in which these objects have been de-historicized by cultural institutions in the present so as not to address the sexual violence against women inherent in them.

Bank crafted her own exhibition and choreographed a dance to take place within the exhibition to brilliantly illuminate how violent, misogynistic Renaissance practices continue to shape present-day embodied representations and lived experiences of women's identities, leveling a piercing critique against Western visual culture and cultural institutions. Bank's delicate, intricate and deeply investigative dance piece skillfully expressed a visual medium in movement and addressed the long history of the nude in art, articulating through choreographic choices the sexist power structures that appear in the paintings she studied.

Professor of Dance and Chair of the Dance Department

Heidi Henderson, who served as the second reader for Bank's thesis and Dance Department adviser, described Bank's choreography as exceptionally daring and praised her ability to create both an evening-length dance and a virtual art exhibit grounded by the historical explication in more traditional thesis writing. "Maddy, a student who came to Conn interested in the romanticism of the Renaissance, has allowed herself to go to a feminist, deceptively beautiful, sometimes grotesque, and always radical place," Henderson said. "She may think of herself as primarily a historian, but she has grown through her four years, and even more so through this process, into an artist."

Associate Professor of Art History and Chair of the Department of Art History and Architectural Studies Karen Gonzalez Rice, who served as Bank's thesis adviser, said Bank's thesis expertly spanned the fields of art history; dance; museum studies; Renaissance studies; and gender, sexuality and intersectionality studies, and called the performance aspect of the thesis "mature, complete, thoughtful and very intense to watch."

In short, Gonzalez Rice said, "Bank's multidisciplinary honors thesis is among the most sophisticated and thoughtful projects that our department has produced."

THE ANNA LORD STRAUSS MEDAL

Anna Lord Strauss, a remarkable woman, was national president of the League of Women Voters, held five presidential appointments to national and international committees and missions, and served Connecticut College as a trustee for the extraordinary term of 32 years. The Anna Lord Strauss Medal is presented in her honor to the graduating senior who has done outstanding work in public or community service, including service to the College.

CHRISTINA CRUZ '20

The 2020 Anna Lord Strauss Medal was awarded to Christina Cruz, a leader, scholar and changemaker who came to Connecticut College from Willimantic, Connecticut.

During her time at Connecticut College, Cruz exemplified the qualities embedded in this honor, contributing greatly to Connecticut College, the city of New London and the state of Connecticut.

As a sociology and Latin American studies double major and scholar in the College's Holleran Center for Community Action, Cruz demonstrated a deep commitment to educational access and social justice for Latinx students and lower income communities in the United States. As a Program in Community Action scholar, Cruz created a course of study focused on understanding and addressing educational disparities in the state of Connecticut with integrative coursework, community-based volunteer work in New London, internships in Hartford, and intensive research on education policy and educational justice during her senior year.

As a sophomore in the Holleran Center gateway course, "Public Policy and Social Ethics," Cruz engaged in critical inquiry about inequity and volunteered at the New London Homeless Hospitality Center. She worked with a team to organize and implement the 11th Annual Walk to End Homelessness to expand campus and community involvement and successfully raise more than \$26,000 for homeless services in the New London community.

At the nexus between scholarship and community action, Cruz began a legislative internship for the state of Connecticut General Assembly during her junior year, working in the office of Connecticut State Senator Douglas McCrory. She conducted legislative research, wrote policy briefs, responded to emails and phone calls from constituents, and participated in Education Committee meetings and public hearings. In the summer before her senior year, Cruz accepted an executive branch internship in the office of Connecticut Governor Ned Lamont. Proving herself driven, passionate and committed to collaboration, Cruz

assisted in the governor's office by conducting research and proposing new policies to enhance educational experiences for students in lower performing school districts. Based on her experience in government and in an independent study in sociology with Professor Ronald Flores, Cruz completed a senior integrative project, "The Puerto Rican Opportunity Gap: Educational Attainment."

Cruz also served as a math tutor for local middle school students through New London's Church of the City and completed a business internship with Atlantic Broadband in Waterford, Connecticut. On campus, Cruz worked for nearly four years as a circulation supervisor at Charles E. Shain Library and served as a student adviser coordinator through the Office of the Dean of First-Year Students, working closely with deans to train sophomore students to advise incoming first-year students during Orientation.

As a sophomore, Cruz served as a student adviser for first-year students in the "Earth Justice" seminar. She has been a leader in the student common interest housing group La Voz Latinx and served as the second chair during her junior year. This student group formed with the vision of creating a space and place that fosters a sense of community and belonging for and among Latinx students. Cruz also served as a big sibling through the ALANA (African American, Latino/a, Asian American and Native American) Sisters and Brothers program, advising and mentoring students of color on campus, and as a Holleran Center Fellow, advising students for community placements and the Center's certificate program, supporting the Center's Enrich Mentor program for students at Bennie Dover Jackson Middle School and helping to develop a tutoring program with New London High School.

Director of Community Engagement and Holleran Center Operations Rebecca McCue wrote of Cruz in 2020, "She has demonstrated that she is committed to taking action for positive social change while maintaining the highest academic standards. Christina is a pleasure to work with and so deserving of this honor."

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Academic Regalia and the Academic Procession. The robes and colorful hoods of the academic regalia have a religious origin. The garments worn today date back to the 12th century, when universities were the training grounds for Europe's clergy.

Current academic dress in the United States is based on an intercollegiate code established in 1895. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves, is untrimmed and is worn closed. The master's gown, worn either open or closed, has long, crescent-shaped sleeves. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is worn closed, and has velvet panels down the front, around the neck and on the sleeves.

The customary head covering is either the mortarboard or the Oxford cap. The mortarboard tassel is black for bachelor's and master's degree holders and gold for those with doctoral degrees. The hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, also is significant. The length and width of the hood and the color of its trim and lining signify the wearer's highest academic achievement and the degree-granting institution. The velvet trim reveals the wearer's major field of study.

Honor cords, sashes or stoles are often awarded to graduating seniors who are members of honor societies, centers for interdisciplinary scholarship or for various academic and nonacademic achievements, awards or honors.

The senior class processes to Tempel Green to begin the Commencement procession reflective of the same tradition that occurs at Convocation and the opening of the academic year when they were first-year students.

The Alma Mater. "Alma Mater by the Sea" was written in the spring of 1920 by two Connecticut College students, Olive Littlehales Corbin '1921 (words) and Edith C. Smith '1920 (music). Their composition prevailed over other original student works in a contest to find a College song. Additional stanzas were added in the late 1980s by Jeffrey G. Barnhart '89 MAT '92 and Claire L. Gaudiani '66.

Bagpipe Music. Scottish or Irish bagpipe bands have long been a special feature of American holiday parades. Connecticut College employs the Manchester Pipe Band to lead the Commencement procession for the same reason that they are so popular in street parades: they add excitement, drama, color and a rousing sound to the occasions. The Manchester Pipe Band was founded in 1914 and is the second oldest pipe band in continuous existence in the United States.

Class Colors and the Class Banner. The tradition of class colors goes back to the very beginning of the College, when the Class of 1919 chose theirs. The next three classes did the same in their first year. Beginning with the Class of 1923, freshmen no longer selected their own colors and instead adopted those of the class that had graduated that spring. The original four color combinations have been in rotation ever since: green and grey, blue and buff, purple and gold, and red and white. The Class of 2020 banner reflects the class colors, which is carried by the class marshals who lead the procession. The banners representing the current four class years are on permanent display in the College Center at Crozier-Williams. Additionally, they are carried in Reunion parades and at the annual Convocation that signifies the start of the academic year.

College Motto. "Tanquam lignum quod plantatum est secus decursus aquarum," which means "Like a tree planted by the rivers of water

(that bringeth forth its fruit in its season)." The motto is a Vulgate version of a phrase from the first psalm. Connecticut College's translation comes from the King James version of the Bible.

College Seal. The College seal is composed of several elements, including two open books, a tree on a background of water and the College's motto: "Tanquam lignum quod plantatum est secus decursus aquarum," which means "Like a tree planted by the rivers of water (that bringeth forth its fruit in its season)." The current seal is based on a design created by Connecticut College's first president (1913-1917), Frederick H. Sykes.

Commencement Saplings. Thanks to the generosity of Athena Tsakanikas-Philippides '86 through the Konstantinos T. Tsakanikas Memorial Fund, graduates are presented with individual white spruce saplings, which they carry as they march. The sapling represents the tree on the College seal, and its growth serves as a reminder of the connections between the graduates, the College and the world. This tradition began with the Class of 1993.

Flags. Connecticut College maintains a collection of international flags that represent the home countries of the College's students, as reflected by the Office of the Registrar. The international flags are displayed on significant ceremonial occasions to celebrate the diverse nature of the student body. The international flag collection is updated each year as new students join the Connecticut College community. In 2019, the College added three flags – those of the Mashantucket Pequot, Mohegan and Eastern Pequot Tribal nations – to acknowledge the land, history and continued presence of the Indigenous peoples of this region.

Laurel Chain. In the spirit of Connecticut College's original founding as a women's college, members of the junior and sophomore classes, dressed in white, carry chains of laurel to guide the graduates to the ceremony. Laurel was traditionally used as a symbol of honor and fame. The ancients presented laurel wreaths to university graduates in rhetoric and poetry. The laurel chain has been part of Connecticut College's ceremonies since the first Class Day in 1919.

The Mace. A mace was originally a weapon consisting of a staff with a ball of steel or brass at one end. The word "mace" comes from the Latin "mateola," meaning mallet. The mace evolved from an instrument of battle to a symbol of authority. Connecticut College's mace was a gift to the College from The Century Council when Claire L. Gaudiani '66 began her presidency in 1988. Designed and fabricated by Richard Scheller '73, it contains brass sleeves with the names of the College presidents.

'Pomp and Circumstance.' The trio section from Sir Edward Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1" is the most popular musical piece at American graduations. The first of five marches by the composer, the piece is a perfect tune for a graduation because its inspirational quality elicits feelings of promise and optimism, while its stately, wistful quality suggests that a milestone has been reached – that we are bidding farewell to the past.

The Presidential Medallion. Featuring the Connecticut College seal, the presidential medallion is worn on ceremonial occasions as part of the president's regalia. It was created for the Inauguration of the College's 10th president, Leo I. Higdon Jr., and was a gift of Trustee Emeritus Linda J. Lear, a 1962 graduate of the College.
