

CONNECTICUT COLLEGE'S TWELFTH PRESIDENT

Andrea E. Chapdelaine

Andrea E. Chapdelaine became Connecticut College's 12th president on July 1, 2024, following a unanimous appointment by the Board of Trustees. With more than 30 years of experience in higher education, she is a strategic and inclusive leader committed to academic excellence, student-centeredness and community-building in service to the College's mission. She is a passionate advocate for providing a personalized, purposeful and integrative education that shapes confident global citizens of character, intellect and action. Since arriving on campus, Chapdelaine has focused on meaningful engagement with the entire Connecticut College community, transparent communication, and strengthening shared governance in order to develop a unified vision that will ensure continued excellence and long-term institutional strength and sustainability. She was inaugurated on April 26, 2025.

Chapdelaine previously served as president of Hood College, where she led two strategic planning initiatives, expanded academic programs, increased enrollment and retention, and oversaw exponential growth in the College's endowment. In recognition of her contributions to Hood, a scholarship for first-generation students was established in her honor. In 2019, Chapdelaine was named one of The Daily Record's 2019 Top 100 Women in Maryland and was appointed to the Governor's

Workforce Development Board, in recognition of her work building partnerships to provide experiential learning opportunities for students and to benefit the public good.

Chapdelaine's deep belief in the critical role of independent colleges and the liberal arts is reflected in her national leadership. She serves on the boards of the American Association of Colleges and Universities and the Council of Independent Colleges, and previously served on the board of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities. She currently serves as a member of a national task force focused on developing strategies to ensure the long-term financial sustainability of private higher education.

A proud first-generation college graduate, Chapdelaine holds a bachelor's degree in psychology and justice studies from the University of New Hampshire and master's and doctoral degrees in social psychology from the University of Connecticut. She has served five private liberal arts colleges, beginning as a faculty member at Wabash College in Crawfordsville, Indiana; Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut; and Albright College in Reading, Pennsylvania. She also served as dean of undergraduate studies and provost at Albright. Her scholarly work has focused on faculty support, the role of undergraduate research in student learning, ethical issues in community-based learning, and procedural justice.

HONORARY DEGREE

LESLIE E. WONG

Leslie E. Wong is a nationally respected leader in higher education. He is a former president of San Francisco State University and Northern Michigan University, and a former interim president of Connecticut College and the University of Southern Colorado.

As a member of the College's Board of Trustees from 2019 to 2023, Wong served on the Executive Committee, chaired the Faculty-Trustee Liaison Committee and served as vice chair of the Committee on Academic Affairs. He served as Connecticut College's interim president from July 1, 2023, until Andrea E. Chapdelaine began her tenure as Conn's 12th president on July 1, 2024.

As Conn's interim president, Wong immediately established himself as a leader who sought to reestablish constructive dialogue and engagement across College constituencies. He worked to provide stability that has been recognized and acknowledged by students, faculty, staff and the senior administration.

A native of Oakland, California, Wong earned a B.A. in psychology from Gonzaga University, an M.S. in experimental psychology from Eastern Washington University and a Ph.D. in educational psychology from Washington State University. He previously served as president of San Francisco

State University, where he is president emeritus, and Northern Michigan University; vice president of Academic Affairs of Valley City State University in North Dakota; interim president, provost and academic vice president of the University of Southern Colorado; and academic dean and faculty member at Evergreen State College in Washington.

Wong's commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion has been evident throughout his career. He served on the NCAA's Task Force on Equity and Inclusion, led a national effort to admit Mexican universities into Division II of the NCAA, and since 1985 has worked closely with the State Department to promote U.S.-China relations as well as the well-being of Chinese Americans. He also led California's statewide effort to expand Project Rebound, a social justice initiative that helps formerly incarcerated students to earn college degrees.

An educational psychologist by training, he is a widely published scholar in the fields of psychology, higher education leadership and diversity, equity and inclusion. His work includes cognitive aspects of supercomputing applications, cross-cultural approaches to teaching math, and cross-cultural counseling, especially in the area of PTSD with Vietnam War veterans and Southeast Asian refugees.

HONORARY DEGREE

MAXIM LANGSTAFF '81

Maxim Langstaff '81 is a Grammy- and Emmy-nominated writer and producer. His creative and editorial work in TV, film, music, print and radio has reached hundreds of millions of people worldwide. A master storyteller, he is widely recognized for his vision, versatility and commitment to conservation and the natural world.

His many credits include producing the multimedia *Making of Sergeant Pepper* with Sir George Martin, featuring Paul McCartney, Ringo Starr, George Harrison and Phil Collins. He wrote, produced and directed the most comprehensive filmed history of the Beatles through the eyes of their producer. Many artists have collaborated with Langstaff on projects he has created, written and produced, including Herbie Hancock, Eric Clapton, Elton John, Joni Mitchell, B.B. King, Tony Bennett, Paul McCartney, Vince Gill, Michael Tilson Thomas, Smokey Robinson, Stephen Schwartz, Jack White, Glen Campbell, Jeff Beck, Carole King, Dave Grohl and Willie Nelson.

He is the creator and executive producer for the PBS documentary series *Soundbreaking*. His acclaimed collaboration with John Denver produced the "Wildlife Concert," the highest-rated music program in cable TV history, and raised awareness and support for wildlife conservation worldwide. During his association with the Wildlife Conservation Society, Langstaff helped lead the largest fundraising effort

(\$100 million) ever undertaken for wildlife conservation. His diverse work in film and music has been honored with multiple awards, including "Best Film" at the International Wildlife Film Festival and the "Parents Choice Award" for The Jackfish.

Langstaff's work has been featured in numerous newspapers and magazines, including The New York Times, Gannett, Wildlife Conservation Magazine, The Philadelphia Inquirer, Disney Magazine and Family Circle. He recently completed his first novel, *In the Raven's Shadow*.

Langstaff is a graduate of the Putney School, Connecticut College and the National Theater Institute. He began his career in the theater, having trained with Morris Carnovsky and, later, Britain's Royal Shakespeare Company. He is the cofounder and former playwright-in-residence of the National Youth Theater at the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center, was a presenter at the Bread Loaf Writers' Conference and served as the Associate Director of the National Theater Institute.

Langstaff has deep ties to Conn. His sister, Lee Langstaff '78, and two cousins, Virginia Lee '70 and Josephine Heminway '85, are also Conn grads. His grandmother, Percy Maxim Lee, a political and social reform activist who was president of the League of Women Voters, served on Conn's Board of Trustees and received the College Medal in 1976.

THE OAKES AND LOUISE AMES PRIZE

The Oakes and Louise Ames Prize, named for a president emeritus of the College and his wife, is given to a graduating senior who has completed the year's most outstanding honors study. The prize is offered by the trustees in recognition of the quality of academic achievement that Oakes and Louise Ames fostered during their 14 years of service to Connecticut College.

OWYN LOUISE LEDINA '25

Owyn Louise Ledina, an English major and educational studies and sociology double minor from Newtown, Connecticut, is awarded the 2025 Oakes and Louise Ames Prize for their honors thesis, "Child's Play: Revolution and Liberation in 21st Century American Children's Speculative Fiction." Ledina's work explores the question of why so much of contemporary American children's literature relies on stories in which children must save the world from evil against impossible odds. Using Suzanne Collins's *The Hunger Games* trilogy and the *Avatar: The Last Airbender* animated series as their main objects of study, Ledina also examines how the protagonists' more "childish" qualities—play, humor, imagination, creativity and joy—influence their character development and the development of their societies.

Throughout the thesis, Ledina regularly combines their own deep knowledge of U.S. children's literature, television and film with scholarly research in the fields of educational theory, pedagogy, critical race theory and postcolonial theory.

In a letter nominating Ledina for the Ames Prize, Associate Professor of English and Chair of the English Department Jeff Strabone called Ledina's thesis "a work of keen original thinking and urgent moral seriousness" that left him feeling hopeful for the future. "This thesis is a vigorous defense of play and games and friendship and their revolutionary potential to liberate us from thinking we can win our oppressors' games," he wrote.

Assistant Professor of English Marie Ostby, who served as Ledina's thesis adviser, praised them for being "completely unafraid to tackle the big questions" of our time. "I cannot think of a more urgent place to turn our critical lens than to these stories about the violent relationship between children and the state, published in the late 2000s and early 2010s when Gen Z's cultural and political imaginations were formed," she said. "Fine-tuning our attention to the urgency of these stories, and the deep injustices embedded within them, is precisely what Owyn has done and done superbly."

CLAIRE GAUDIANI '66 PRIZE

The Claire Gaudiani '66 Prize for Excellence in the Senior Integrative Project is awarded annually to the student with the best SIP in one of the College's interdisciplinary centers.

SKYLER KILAN KARDELL '25

Skyler Kilan Kardell, an environmental studies and architectural studies double major and scholar in the Goodwin-Niering Center for the Environment from Nantucket, Massachusetts, is awarded the 2025 Claire Gaudiani '66 Prize for his honors thesis and senior integrative project, "Vagrancy and Exploration: A Summary of the Literature and Conceptualization of an Ongoing Paradigm Shift Within Ornithology, Citizen Science and Philosophy of Evolution as It Relates to the Marginal Distributions of Birds."

Blending ornithology, philosophy of science, evolutionary theory, conservation biology and literary history, Kardell's work is a sustained critique of the concept of "vagrant" birds, or birds found far outside of their usual ranges. Kardell challenges the conventional view that when a bird is found in an area far from its usual habitat or migratory path, something must be wrong—that the vagrancy is an aberration that must result either from external conditions that overwhelm the animal or else an internal malfunction that leads it to fly the "wrong" way. Instead, Kardell makes

a compelling case that these are normal birds at the leading edge of population dispersal. He suggests that instead of thinking of birds as vagrant, they should be considered peripatetic—moving around all the time with migratory paths that are not as fixed and straightforward as commonly assumed.

"Skyler's thesis is an audacious argument for revising scientific concepts," Derek D. Turner, Class of 1943 Professor of Philosophy and Karla Heurich Harrison '28 Director of the Goodwin-Niering Center for the Environment, wrote in a letter nominating Kardell, his advisee, for the Gaudiani Prize. "His ideas about evolution are creative and transformative, and his reframing of high risk/high payoff dispersal behaviors is highly relevant to understanding speciation in the Anthropocene. We cannot begin to wrap our minds around the current biodiversity crisis unless we can understand how human activities might be affecting speciation rates and patterns, and dispersal behavior is central to understanding how speciation works in birds."

THE ANNA LORD STRAUSS MEDAL

Anna Lord Strauss was national president of the League of Women Voters, held five presidential appointments to national and international committees and missions, and served Connecticut College as a trustee for the extraordinary term of 32 years. The Anna Lord Strauss Medal is presented in her honor to the graduating senior who has done outstanding work in public or community service, including service to the College.

Ana Ya Ling Flood '25

Ana Ya Ling Flood, an English and government double major and scholar in the Holleran Center for Community Action and Public Policy from Sherman, Connecticut, is awarded the 2025 Anna Lord Strauss Medal.

Flood has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to public service and social justice at Connecticut College; in New London; and in Boston, Massachusetts. A leader and a trailblazer, Flood brings people and resources together, creating communities of care to support the at-risk and marginalized.

On campus, Flood has served as president of the Feminist Coalition, co-chair and senior adviser of Asian Students in Action (ASIA), vice president and senior adviser of the PERIOD Club and a mentor for local middle school students through the ENRICH program. She also conducted outreach for SafetyNet, the peer education component of the Office of Sexual Violence Prevention and Advocacy. In Boston, Flood served as a fellow with Forest Foundation, was a grant writer for the Matahari Women Workers Center

and completed an internship with YWCA Cambridge.

Flood coordinated a pioneering collaboration between ASIA and the United States Coast Guard's Asian Pacific American Council; revived a student initiative to raise and distribute more than \$7,000 to marginalized Conn students; and led an initiative to install 32 free period product dispensers across campus, package and distribute 8,500 tampons and pads to public health organizations, and provide 226 free sustainable menstrual cups to menstruators on campus and in New London.

In a letter nominating Flood for the Strauss Medal, Director of Career Development and Curricular Management Dot Wang said Flood "inspires people to do the hard work" of change. "Bringing people together to the benefit of everyone involved is Ana's strong suit. Her ability to not only help in crises, but develop a system to provide ongoing support where it is needed embodies her public service mindset."

RETIRING CONNECTICUT COLLEGE FACULTY

Jefferson A. Singer

Faulk Foundation Professor of Psychology

Jefferson Singer earned a B.A. from Amherst College and an M.S., M.Phil and Ph.D. from Yale University. He joined Connecticut College in 1988.

A member of Phi Beta Kappa, Singer was awarded a Thomas J. Watson Fellowship upon graduation from Amherst. He completed his clinical psychology internship and postdoctoral fellowship at the University of California San Francisco School of Medicine.

After joining Conn's faculty, Singer received the Dana Faculty Fellowship, an award given to junior faculty judged most likely to contribute important research in their chosen fields. Over the subsequent 37 years, he taught a range of courses, with his signature courses including "Personality Psychology," "Seminar in Couple and Family Therapy" and the "Practicum in Clinical and Community Psychology." He supervised 97 senior honors and master's theses, as well as countless individual studies. Committed to the New London community, he served as the first faculty director of the Holleran Center for Community Action and Public Policy and has remained on its steering board ever since. From 2015 to 2021, he served as dean of the College.

In his role as professor and as dean, he helped to secure over \$2 million in grant funding from the Mellon Foundation, the Endeavor Foundation and the Campus Compact Institute to support research, curricular and community initiatives. Working with fellow faculty, staff and students, he played an important role in implementing the innovative Connections general education program during his time as chair of FSCC and while serving as dean

of the College. As dean, he also supervised the establishment of the Hale Center for Career Development, the initiation of the partnership with the New York Posse Program (having served as a mentor himself for the Chicago Class of 2014 Posse), and was instrumental in renewing the College's partnership with the Thomas J. Watson Foundation.

He has published over 130 articles, chapters and reviews, and eight books in the fields of personality, autobiographical memory, addiction and clinical psychology, including most recently a collection of his poetry. He is recognized as the developer of the concept of "self-defining memories," which has been adopted and studied by laboratories across the world. Many of his publications have been co-authored by Connecticut College students. He received the Henry A. Murray Award for the Study of Lives and the Theodore R. Sarbin Award for his work in narrative psychology, both from the American Psychological Association, of which he is also a fellow. In 2003, a Fulbright Distinguished Scholar Award enabled him to research self-defining memories in England. He returned there in 2008 through an ESRC/SSRC Visiting Fellowship for further work on autobiographical memory. He served as one of the founding associate editors for Qualitative Psychology and associate editor for the Journal of Personality and Contemporary Psychology, and has sat on the editorial boards of multiple journals, including Imagination, Cognition, and Personality, and Pragmatic Case Studies in Psychotherapy. He is a past recipient of the Nancy Batson Nisbet Rash Research Scholar Award.

Peter Siver

Charles and Sarah P. Becker '27 Professor of Botany and Environmental Studies

Peter Siver earned his B.A. from SUNY Binghamton, his M.S. from the University of New Hampshire and his Ph.D. from the University of Connecticut. He joined Connecticut College in 1990.

A noted expert in limnology, the study of lakes, and phycology, the study of algae, Siver has examined the impacts of acid deposition, nutrient pollution, salt contamination, warming, and shifting wind patterns on lakes in eastern North America, ranging from Florida to Newfoundland. In Connecticut, Siver and his students demonstrated that a lake's response to acid deposition is highly influenced by geology and land use patterns. His works have documented historical changes in 50 Connecticut lakes over the last century, establishing a benchmark for future long-term monitoring programs. Siver and his students have completed biotic surveys of algal floras in the Adirondack and Pocono mountains, the Atlantic Coastal Plain, New England, the Canadian maritime, Argentina and the Russian Arctic.

Siver's work extends into paleontology, using microscopic fossils to examine impacts of past global warming events over the last 80 million years, the formation of low-latitude glaciers during the Cretaceous and to calibrate molecular phylogenies with geologic time.

He has earned 80 grants, including about \$4 million

from the National Science Foundation during its 35 years of continual support for his lake algae research. Siver has served on six editorial boards, including 25 years of service to the Connecticut Institute of Water Resources.

Siver's numerous awards include two OPUS Awards from NSF to archive his decades of research on 350 East Coast lakes in three international museums, and his extensive fossil collection; a Darbaker Prize from the American Botanical Society; a Research Award from the North American Lakes Management Society; and the Gerald W. Prescott Award and Award of Excellence from the Phycological Society of America.

He has written more than 179 peer-reviewed articles and four books and edited two volumes. He has discovered 120 new species of chrysophytes and diatoms (microscopic algae), several new genera, a new and rare rotosphaerid, a sponge, and is a co-author on a publication detailing the discovery of an ancient fish. He has taught many classes in biology, botany, environmental studies, phycology, limnology and geographic information systems, and was director of the Environmental Studies program at Conn for 31 years.

Siver was elected to the Connecticut Academy of Science and Engineering in 2023.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Academic Regalia and the Academic Procession. The robes and colorful hoods of the academic regalia have a religious origin. The style of the garments worn today dates back to the 12th century, when universities were the training grounds for Europe's clergy.

Current academic dress in the United States is based on an intercollegiate code established in 1895. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves, is untrimmed and is worn closed. The master's gown, worn either open or closed, has long, crescent-shaped sleeves. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is worn closed, and has velvet panels down the front, around the neck and on the sleeves.

The customary head covering is either the mortarboard or the Oxford cap. The mortarboard tassel is black for bachelor's and master's degree holders and gold for those with doctoral degrees. The hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, also is significant. The length and width of the hood and the color of its trim and lining signify the wearer's highest academic achievement and the degree-granting institution. The velvet trim reveals the wearer's major field of study.

Honor cords, sashes or stoles are often awarded to graduating seniors who are members of honor societies, centers for interdisciplinary scholarship or for various academic and nonacademic achievements, awards or honors.

The senior class processes to Tempel Green to begin the Commencement processional reflective of the same tradition that occurs at Convocation and the opening of the academic year when they were first-year students.

- The Alma Mater. "Alma Mater by the Sea" was written in the spring of 1920 by two Connecticut College students, Olive Littlehales Corbin '21 (words) and Edith C. Smith '20 (music). Their composition prevailed over other original student works in a contest to find a College song. Additional stanzas were added in the late 1980s by Jeffrey G. Barnhart '89 MAT '92 and Claire L. Gaudiani '66.
- Bagpipe Music. Scottish or Irish bagpipe bands have long been a special feature of American holiday parades. Connecticut College employs the Manchester Pipe Band to lead the Commencement procession for the same reason that they are so popular in street parades: they add excitement, drama, color and a rousing sound to the occasions. The Manchester Pipe Band was founded in 1914 and is the second-oldest pipe band in continuous existence in the United States.
- Class Colors and the Class Banner. The tradition of class colors goes back to the very beginning of the College, when the class of 1919 chose theirs. The next three classes did the same in their first year. Beginning with the class of 1923, freshmen no longer selected their own colors and instead adopted those of the class that had graduated that spring. The original four color combinations have been in rotation ever since: green and grey, blue and buff, purple and gold, and red and white. The Class of 2024 banner reflects the class colors, which is carried by the class marshals who lead the procession. The banners representing the current four class years are on permanent display in the College Center at Crozier-Williams. Additionally, they are carried in Reunion parades and at the annual Convocation that signifies the start of the academic year.
- College Motto. "Tanquam lignum quod plantatum est secus decursus aquarum," which means "Like a tree planted by the

- rivers of water (that bringeth forth its fruit in its season)." The motto is a Vulgate version of a phrase from the first psalm. Connecticut College's translation comes from the King James version of the Bible.
- College Seal. The College seal is composed of several elements, including two open books, a tree on a background of water and the College's motto: "Tanquam lignum quod plantatum est secus decursus aquarum," which means "Like a tree planted by the rivers of water (that bringeth forth its fruit in its season)." The current seal is based on a design created by Connecticut College's first president (1913-1917), Frederick H. Sykes.
- Commencement Saplings. Thanks to the generosity of Athena Tsakanikas-Philippides'86 through the Konstantinos T. Tsakanikas Memorial Fund, graduates are presented with individual spruce saplings, which they carry as they march. The sapling represents the tree on the College seal, and its growth serves as a reminder of the connections among the graduates, the College and the world. This tradition began with the Class of 1993.
- Flags. Connecticut College maintains a collection of international flags that represent the countries of the College's students. The international flags are displayed on significant ceremonial occasions to celebrate the diverse nature of the student body. The international flag collection is updated each year as new students join the Connecticut College community. In 2019, the College added three flags—those of the Mashantucket Pequot, Mohegan and Eastern Pequot Tribal nations—to acknowledge the land, history and continued presence of the Indigenous peoples of this region.
- Laurel Chain. In the spirit of Connecticut College's original founding as a women's college, members of the junior and sophomore classes, dressed in white, carry chains of laurel to guide the graduates to the ceremony. Laurel was traditionally used as a symbol of honor and fame. The ancients presented laurel wreaths to university graduates in rhetoric and poetry. The laurel chain has been part of Connecticut College's ceremonies since the first Class Day in 1919.
- The Mace. A mace was originally a weapon consisting of a staff with a ball of steel or brass at one end. The word "mace" comes from the Latin "mateola," meaning mallet. The mace evolved from an instrument of battle to a symbol of authority. Connecticut College's mace was a gift to the College from The Century Council when Claire L. Gaudiani '66 began her presidency in 1988. Designed and fabricated by Richard Scheller '73, it contains brass sleeves with the names of the College presidents.
- 'Pomp and Circumstance.' The trio section from Sir Edward Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1" is the most popular musical piece played at American graduations. The first of five marches by the composer, the piece is a perfect tune for a graduation because its inspirational quality elicits feelings of promise and optimism, while its stately, wistful quality suggests that a milestone has been reached—that we are bidding farewell to the past.
- The Presidential Medallion. Featuring the Connecticut College seal, the presidential medallion is worn on ceremonial occasions as part of the president's regalia. It was created for the Inauguration of the College's 10th president, Leo I. Higdon Jr., and was a gift of Trustee Emeritus Linda J. Lear, a 1962 graduate of the College.



The Manchester Pipe Band is a not-for-profit organization focused on performance and instruction of traditional Scottish and Irish music, and is based in Manchester, Connecticut. Organized in 1914 by the large immigrant community who worked principally in the textile mills of

Manchester, the band has operated continuously for 111 years, making it one of the oldest bagpipe bands in North America. A year-round schedule of performance, instruction and musical competition has the band performing at local musical events and ceremonies, providing tuition-free instruction on a weekly basis, and traveling regularly with two competition groups in the eastern United States, Canada and occasionally Scotland.
