

You'll be able to afford a Connecticut College education. Our comprehensive fee-

which includes tuition, room, board, fees, special programs, some course-related travel and study away—is \$82,697 for the 2023-2024 academic year. Our aid packages are very generous:

 We meet 100% of demonstrated need for all admitted students, regardless of citizenship.

Financial aid is available only to international students who matriculate in the fall semester.

 Merit scholarships are also awarded regardless of citizenship.



And we make it easy for you to apply!

- There is no fee to submit your application to Connecticut College.
- We do not require standardized test scores. You may submit the SAT, ACT or two SAT Subject Tests of your choosing, but there is no disadvantage should you choose not to submit any standardized test scores.



NOTE: We require proof of English proficiency if English is not the language of your academic instruction. We accept the TOEFL, DET, IELTS or PTE. While there are no minimum required scores, successful applicants typically score around a 100 on the TOEFL, a 130 on the DET, a 7.0 on the IELTs, and a 68 on the PTE.


