### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### HOW DOES A VIRTUAL VISIT WORK?

- Similar to WhatsApp, Skype and FaceTime, a Virtual Visit allows you to meet with a provider via video. Like an in-person visit, a Virtual Visit can be made same-day.
- + 15 minutes before your session starts, you will receive an email and/or a text message with a direct link to your video session. Click the link to enter your date of birth and electronically sign any consent form.
- When you connect to the video session, your provider will be notified and will join.

# CAN I RECEIVE PRESCRIPTIONS FROM A VIRTUAL VISIT?

\* Yes. Prescriptions are handled in the same manner as an in-person visit and are delivered electronically to the patient's pharmacy. Narcotics may not be prescribed during a virtual visit.

## WHAT DEVICES DO I NEED?

- Smartphone, tablet, laptop or desktop with internet connection.
- Webcam and mic if using a desktop.

\*Google Chrome is preferred, but Internet Explorer and Firefox are also compatible.

## WHO CAN BE SEEN VIA A VIRTUAL VISIT?

- Anyone over the age of 6 months old who is physically located within the State of Connecticut during the virtual visit.
- Non-life-threatening injuries and illnesses need immediate care, too.
