    - Noncustodial 2019 signed federal tax return, with all schedules with W2 statements, if applicable
    - 2019 Corporate and/or Partnership federal tax return(s) and Schedule K1 statements, if applicable
    - Non-Tax Filer statement - if you were not required to file a 2019 federal tax return, please submit a Student Non-Tax Filer Statement
    - If your parent(s) were not required to file a 2019 federal tax return, please submit a Parent Non-Tax Filer Statement.
  
- Noncustodial Parent’s Profile** – if applicable

If your parents are divorced, separated, or were never married and are living apart, your noncustodial parent is required to complete the Noncustodial Parent’s PROFILE online if you are applying for institutional need based grant aid. The student can enter the noncustodial email address in their College Board portal and College Board will notify the noncustodial parent they can enter their noncustodial application.
