2026-2027 Returning Student Application Instructions **US Citizens and Permanent Residents**

Requirements due by May 15, 2026 - Penalties may be applied for late submission. Please routinely check your Self-Service portal on CamelWeb as additional documents may be required. 2026-2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) – available for online completion on October 1, 2025 at: https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa Title IV school code: 001379 This form is required to determine your eligibility for federal and state grants, federal loans, and federal student employment. Not required to be considered for a merit scholarship. 2026-2027 CSS PROFILE Application – available for online completion on October 1, 2025 at: http://student.collegeboard.org/css-financial-aid-profile CSS school code: 3284 This form is required to determine eligibility for need-based institutional grant aid only. It is not necessary to complete this form if you wish to be considered for a merit scholarship, or if you are only applying for federal and state grants, loans, and/or student employment. - completed Parent Non-Tax Filer Statement
- Parent(s) 2024 W-2 forms
- 2024 Schedule K1's for partnership or corporate owners

Noncustodial Parent Information: In an effort to reduce the number of items a student needs to provide, we do not require noncustodial parent information be submitted annually. However, the noncustodial parent has the option of requesting a formal review of their current information. Unless you or your noncustodial parent advise us otherwise, Connecticut College will use last year's application as a basis for determining the 2026-2027 noncustodial contribution. (Note: if the parents divorced or separated since the last time the student applied for aid, we will need the noncustodial parent to complete the CSS Profile Noncustodial Parent Statement and submit their 2024 taxes and W2s to our office.) Only the custodial parent's information should be used to complete the CSS Profile and FAFSA as outlined above.
