1. You *must be the owner* of the video *and have it uploaded* to Youtube in order to add & edit captions for it

Uploading Caption Files of Transcript Files to Youtube Videos

- Caption files contain both text and time codes.
- **Transcript files** only contain text and are saved as a plain text file (.txt). However, if the video is in English, YouTube can automatically synchronize your transcript with the video to create a caption file.



 If you are using a *caption file*, select *upload a file*. Select the *subtitles file type* and click *Transcribe* + *AutoSync*. Select under *Actions* button. Preview the captions in the editor and make any necessary edits, then select *publish*.



2. If you are using a *transcript file*, choose *transcribe and set timings*. Push *play* to listen to your video and *type the words you hear as you hear them*. The video will automatically pause when you type and resume when you stop typing.

3. This allows you to *automatically align the timing*s of your transcript to your video within YouTube. Select the *actions* dropdown menu and choose *upload a file*. Select the *transcript file type* and click *choose file*. Select the *upload button*. Click *set timings* to

Once the captioning file is available, *review the timing* to ensure accuracy and select *publish*. You can edit each transcription at this time as well to make sure it is exactly what the voice is saying



Automatically Creating Caption Files from YouTube Videos

- YouTube has provided a way to create caption files from videos you have uploaded (**This** option usually had many errors and requires a lot of editing).
- This option usually works best when the audio is very clear with little background interference.
- Automatic captioning may not be available for all videos.
- 1. In the *subtitles and CC* tab select the *automatic captions* option (usually listed as *"English (Automatic)"* if available).

- 2. Play the video and review the captions provided. To *edit the captioning file*, select the *edit* button and choose *overwrite*. Then *select the line that needs repair* in the captioning editor text box.
- 3. Use the *add* and *remove* icons to add and remove captions as needed.



4. After completing the captioning edits, select *publish* to create the new caption file.
